## Upper and Lower Case

1. Always use 2 hands on the keyboard



2. Hold down the shift key for one or two capital letters.



3. Only use CAPS LOCK FOR LOTS OF CAPITALS.



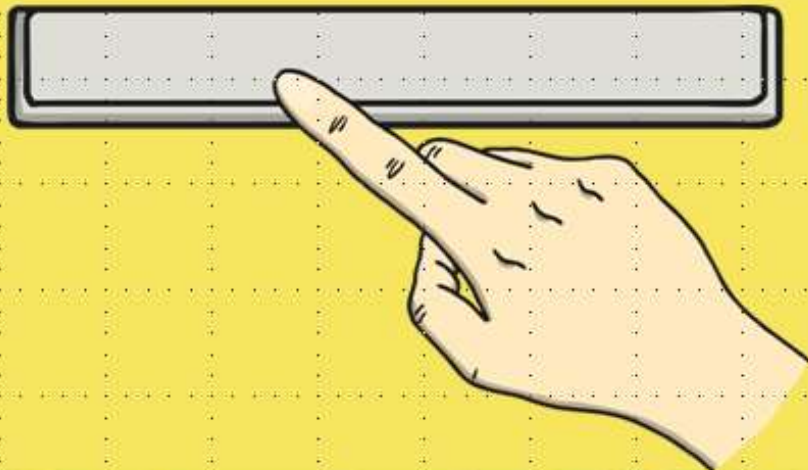
### Remember

CAPITALS on a computer is regarded as shouting.



## Space

Press the space bar **once** after each word and full stop.



## At the End of a Line...

Carry on typing at the end of a line...

... unless it's the end of a paragraph, a title, a list or a poem.



## And Now For Some Sentences...



Remember:

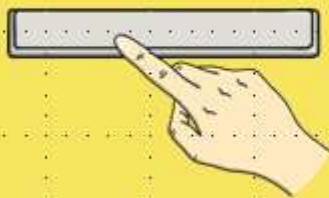
2 hands.



Hold shift for capitals.



One space.


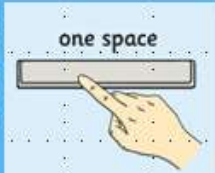




Keep on typing at the end of a line.
